

## 5<sup>th</sup> class trip to Mary Immaculate training college

## **Standardised Testing:**

Standardised test scores compare an individual child's achievement to that of a 'reference group' of children nationally. This year we have changed from using the Sigma T and Micra T tests to Drumcondra Primary Maths and Drumcondra Primary English. All classes from 1st to 6th have undertaken these tests during the past three weeks. Please note you may see differences between your child's results on the new tests and their results on older tests. Many tests become easier over time, as the content becomes more familiar. The results of these tests will be included in the annual end of year school report
