Dear Parents/Guardians,

A big welcome back to school to everyone. A very special welcome to all our new infants and to the new children who started in other classes. We wish them all the best for their time in Knockanean N.S. We wish last year's 6th class all the best as they start their new secondary schools. Welcome back to all the staff and we wish them well for the year ahead. We welcome Crea Phillips and we wish her all the best in her role as Deputy Principal and Orla Moloney, who will be with us for the next few weeks.

School Times: We have been advised by our insurer to inform you of the following- The school will open to receive pupils at 8.45 a.m. No responsibility is accepted for pupils arriving before that time. Classes will commence each day at 9.00 a.m. Classes will end each day at 1.40 p.m. for Junior /Senior Infants and at 2.40 p.m. for all other classes. Parents who wish to have their children escorted home should make their own arrangements to have them met at the school gate and the person to escort them should be at the school no later than 1.40 p.m. in the case of infants and 2.40 p.m. for all others, as the school cannot accept responsibility for supervising the children after the official finishing times or investigating any incidents that arise after these times.

CCTV: As you are aware we have CCTV on the school premises. The CCTV system is in operation in the external environs of the premises during both the daylight and night hours each day. CCTV surveillance at the school is intended for the purposes of:

- protecting the school buildings and school assets, both during and after school hours;
- reducing the incidence of crime and anti-social behaviour (including theft and vandalism);
- supporting the Gardaí in a bid to deter and detect crime;

• assisting in identifying, apprehending and prosecuting offenders.

Say Yes to Languages: Towards the end of last year we applied to take part in a programme called "Say Yes to Languages". We were successful in our application and as a result classes 4th, 5th & 6th will receive French lessons once per week, for a total of 8 weeks. These will take place this term. We have received funding for this programme so there is no cost to parents. The lessons will be delivered during the school day by Rachel Frawley and will start on Oct 4th

Music Club/ Choir: Music club has started up again for this year. It will be on every Tuesday from 2.45 to 3.40. Children from 1st class up who can already play an instrument are more than welcome. Please note it is not a beginners class. Children need to be able to play their instrument. In the music club they play a mixture of traditional and popular music. It is an opportunity for the children to play together as a group, have fun and learn a few tunes along the way..

Choir: It will be on every Thurs from 2.45 pm to 3.40.p.m.

Sport: Boys and girls football training has already started back. Competitions will commence in the next few weeks. Cross country running will take place on Wed September 25th

Homework Club. This is a service run by the teachers in the school. It runs 4 days a week from Monday to Thursday. Homework Club finishing time is 3.50 pm this year. During Homework Club, the children will do their homework and the teachers will assist them with any part of the work that needs help. If the children are finished their homework, other activities will be provided for the children such as reading, colouring, board games etc. If you are interested in your child doing Homework Club this year, you can reply to the following email address. knockaneanhomeworkclub@gmail.com

Home school communications: All teachers have provided you with their school email. Should you wish to contact them/send in a sick note/explain an absence etc this must be done via email or through Aladdin .

Appointments: Appointments can be made by ringing the school or sending a message directly to the teacher by email.

Pupil Absences: (Education Welfare Act 2000). All absences totalling more than 20 days have to be reported to the National Education Welfare Board. **Please note you can update pupil absences yourself on Aladdin Connect.** If you do not use Aladdin Connect to update your child's absence, **Written confirmation by email** to your child's teacher is required, out-lining the commencement date, the return date and the reason for being absent. Please do not send in any written notes. Phone calls to the school or verbal messages to the teacher are not sufficient.

Sick Cert: If you have a sick cert from a doctor/hospital explaining your child's absence please take a photo of this cert and email it to the class teacher.

Complaints Procedures: The Board of Management has adopted the INTO/CPSMA Revised Parental Complaints Procedure which provides a mechanism for dealing fairly with parental complaints. This was sent to you in January of this year but I've attached a copy for your convenience. Please note that the class teacher is the first point of contact if there is an issue.

Healthy Lunch: Well done to everyone who is making the effort with the healthy lunch policy-not alone is it healthier but it is also cheaper.

Please remember: The following are <u>not allowed</u> in school: Crisps, Fizzy Drinks, Chewing Gum

As there are a number of children in various classes throughout the school who suffer from serious allergies to nuts and kiwi fruit, we ask parents to refrain from putting kiwi fruit, nuts or products containing nuts (such as chocolate spreads of any kind; peanut butter, some cereal bars etc) into their child's lunch box.

For those pupils with EpiPens, could you please send in **two** Epipens to your child's class teacher. Please ensure they are in date

Birthday invitations: Birthday invitations are <u>not to be given out in the school or school</u> <u>grounds.</u> The Board of Management has chosen to adopt this policy so that no pupil feels left out when birthday invitations are being handed out.

Birthday treats: As mentioned above due to the high number of children in classes with various allergies we ask that you do not send in cakes/treats etc for your child's birthday

Cycling: We ask that pupils please wear a helmet at all times and be mindful of the traffic on the road. We also ask that motorists be mindful of those cycling and walking to school and exercise extreme caution and patience as you approach and leave the school

Personal belongings/Clothes: We would ask every parent to make sure that there is a name tag on all jackets/tops, lunch boxes, drinks bottles etc.

School Breaks: Break times are as follows:

Sos: 11.00-11.10 a.m. All classes

Lunch: 12.20 pm - 12.50 pm Infants- 2^{nd}

On wet days classes stay in their rooms as normal during break and are supervised by the teachers on yard duty. If your child is sick please keep them at home as we cannot facilitate them staying in classrooms during break times.

Mobile Phones: Mobile phones are <u>forbidden</u> in the school. If a pupil is caught using a mobile phone in the school then the phone will be confiscated and will not be returned for a period of one week. It will only be returned to a parent at that time. If a parent finds it necessary for their child to have a mobile for use after school, then the parent must email the school requesting same. The pupil is then responsible for handing in the phone to their teacher in the morning at the start of school and collecting it in the evening at 2.40 pm.

Videos/ Photographs: Please note that if parents/guardians take photographs or videos of school events for private, personal use they **must not** be uploaded to any website to be viewed by others (e.g. Facebook).

Photographs/Website: If anyone does not wish to have their children photographed, **it is your responsibility** to please let us know by email.

Photos of pupils are also posted on our website displaying their work, in sports teams, in school plays etc. If you **do not want** your child's photo posted on the website **it is your responsibility** to let us know by email.

E payments: The E payment system allows you to make secure payments to the school using your credit or debit card. The purpose of the E payment system is to facilitate the easier payment of school money collections for parent/guardians and to reduce the amount of cash and cheques being sent into our school in line with recent central bank directives. E payments are through Aladdin and if you need further information on this system please contact the office. **All money collections this year will be enabled for E payments.**

Parking: Please try to be sensible and considerate about parking in and around the school when dropping and collecting your children. Please do not park in front of the school gates, in front of empty parking spaces or in front of another car, thereby blocking their exit. Please be mindful of the local residents and the need for them to be able to access their property at all times. Please do not park in front of their driveway. A little patience on everybody's part can make all the difference. **The disabled parking space must be left free for use by pupils in the school.**

School Uniform: The uniform consists of a crested sweat shirt top in either Jade Green or Purple and crested polo shirt in the same colours. Children are allowed to choose which colour they would like to wear along with the alternate colour polo shirt i.e. purple sweatshirt with a jade green polo shirt or jade green sweatshirt with a purple polo shirt. The bottom part of the uniform is <u>navy (not black)</u> trousers/tracksuit pants/skirt. <u>Please note that branded tracksuits are not allowed.</u>

- Station Teaching: In class or small group withdrawal. 1st -6th classes as needed

Science & Technology: (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Maths) S.T.E.A.M: Sustained Support for school Year 24/25

Aistear: Framework for Early Childhood Education- Teaching through play- Junior and Senior Infants.

Wellness Over the coming weeks we hope to engage in the School Self Evaluation process to introduce and implement the School Wellbeing Framework. Parents and pupils will be surveyed to investigate their opinions on wellbeing in the school and responses to this data will help us to identify our focus targets for our School Improvement Plan.

Children's Well-Being Weaving Well-Being is the first Irish designed positive mental health programme of its kind which aims to enhance well-being in children. This Positive Education programme consists of 10 lessons for each class level and is grounded in evidence-based interventions from the rapidly expanding field of Positive Psychology. Positive Psychology is the science of well-being. It is underpinned by the concept that a state of well-being is not simply the absence of the negative, but the presence of the positive.

Weaving Well-Being gives children the opportunity to weave positivity into their daily lives through a range of activities in a variety of areas. These areas include identifying and using their authentic character strengths, boosting positive emotions, developing and nurturing positive relationships and connections, building practical resilience skills (including mindfulness) and developing self-efficacy through empowering beliefs.

Weaving Wellbeing will be done in 3rd, 4th and 5th classes this year. The lessons are designed to be implemented within the framework of the S.P.H.E curriculum.

Primary Language Curriculum: We will continue to implement the PLC

Revised Maths Curriculum: In school and Education Centre Training for implementation of same. Please note school will be closed on <u>Thurs January 23rd 2025</u> to facilitate training in the Revised Maths curriculum. So far this is the only date we are aware of.

Swimming: Swimming will take place this year for all classes from $1^{st} - 6^{th}$ in Shannon. You will be notified in advance of when your child's class will be going. 6^{th} class have started this week

Accelerated Reading: Accelerated Reader (AR) is a whole-group reading management and monitoring programme that aims to foster the habit of independent reading among primary age pupils. The internet-based software initially screens pupils according to their reading levels, and suggests books that match their reading age and reading interest. Pupils take computerised quizzes on the books they have read and earn AR points related to difficulty.

This initiative will continue this year in classes 2^{nd} - 6^{th} .To log in to Accelerated Reading go to the school website knockaneannationalschool.com and select the AR icon.

Personal Insurance: The school offers the facility of a Pupil Personal Accident Insurance Scheme. This offers 24 hour cover including social, domestic and leisure cover as well as school activities. Full pupil participation in the scheme is recommended. The cost of the scheme is €8 per pupil, which represents excellent value for money. E payments has been enabled for payment of same

Administration / Art and Crafts Charges

The Board of Management have decided to continue with the reduced prices for this coming year due to the on-going increases in the cost of living and the possible family financial circumstances related to this
