Building Update

- The OPW are on schedule to commence work on the current Knockanean site as soon as we close for the summer holidays. A contractor is due to be appointed to this project at the end of April/early May.

Agree to Agree Project

We are delighted to announce that Dr. Maureen Griffin will host a face to face session for the parents of Knockanean National School Monday 9th June 2025. This coincides nicely with our Agree to Agree project. The parent talk "Social Media: Challenges for Parents" will provide an overview of what is currently popular among Irish students, what the potential dangers are and offer practical advice on how to protect children when they are online or using their mobile devices. Issues such as age inappropriate apps; social networking sites; social messaging/chatting apps; video-streaming sites; mobile device safety; screen time & sleep; grooming; gaming and cyber-bullying will be addressed. The parent talk will make you as parents aware of the dangers and highlight some practical tips. The parent talk will last for a little over 1 hour in length with time afterwards for questions and answers.

The next step is to form a draft agreement which we will be seeking your feedback on in the coming weeks. Our actual agreement will be launched in September 2025 and it will be a three year process. Currently, children from 3rd, 4th and 5th class have been asked to design a front cover and a back cover which could be used for our Internet Acceptable Use Policy booklet. We have also asked the children to think of a slogan or saying which can be used in our booklet. Children could also come up with a character which we could use throughout our booklet. We look forward to seeing the designs.
